and I can promise the audience who comes that I don't think they'll be bored," Geslison said, calling it a performance that offers something for everyone.

The show's title reflects the "gathering of different cultures on stage," the director said.

Performers are university students. The Texarkana stop closes a 3 1/2-week tour.

"They are stellar young students, and I know the audience will thoroughly enjoy watching them perform," Geslison said.

Justin Kelly is one of those students. He's finishing up his senior year and has been dancing with the program for four years, touring with this team for three.

"What I enjoy about dancing with the group is that in our shows we try to cover a wide variety of cultures in one night," Kelly said.

It's almost like visiting each of these places during the performance, teaching the dancers about the people, cultures and values, he said.

Dancers must move quickly

through each type of dance, for example, from a French Canadian dance to American clogging.

"We have to learn to be adaptable when we're switching styles" to capture the intricacies of each culture's dance, Kelly said, likening it to switching gears in a car.

While here, the ensemble will conduct a workshop with local dance students who will join the BYU crew on stage before the show.

"We hope that our last show will be our best and that we have great support from your community," Geslison said.

Around the world with BYU Folk Dance Ensemble

Journey across the globe with Brigham Young University's International Folk Dance Ensemble when they visit Texarkana to share "The Gathering."

BYU's ensemble shares traditional dance moves originating from Ireland, India, Slovakia, Hungary, Ukraine, Mexico and other locations, including the U.S., on Saturday, May 19, when they perform at Pleasant Grove High School's Performing Arts Center. The show starts at 7:30 p.m.

"Our show is a little like making a trip around the world without leaving your seat," said Jeanette Geslison, artistic director.

Dances range from an Irish soft shoe dance to flamboyant

Ukrainian dance moves, lively Bollywood dancing and everything in between. The ensemble consists of 30 dancers (15 couples) and seven musicians.

"We try to give the audience a variety of cultural tastes through dance and music," Geslison said, adding "some of those are very traditional, and some of them take a more contemporary approach."

American dances include Civil War waltzes and music, plus contemporary American clogging with a bit of a modern kick, the director said.

"We do a Gypsy dance from Transylvania, which is done in a traditional way," Geslison said.

Two dances come from India. One is a snazzy Bollywood dance, the other a classical dance with

roots thousands of years old and intricate hand and eye movements.

A Mexican suite includes numbers originating from the Jalisco and Veracruz regions. In one dance, two sweethearts come together.

Geslison said the Hungarian dance suite includes dancing with props and, to round out the evening, the ensemble shares dancing from the Ukraine.

"Our show has quite the variety,"

BYU dancers to perform in Elko

ELKO — The Elko Convention Center will soon be bustling with an array of dance styles.

At 7:30 p.m. March 2, members of Brigham Young University's critically acclaimed International Folk Dance Ensemble will bring their talents to the Elko stage.

The folk dance team brings the world's cultures together in an energetic and thrilling performance called "The Gathering."

The Gathering includes Irish hard shoe, American clogging, Ukrainian Hopak, exotic Indian dances and other music and dances from around the world in a stunning 90-minute performance. The show incorporates dance and music from Eastern and Western Europe, the Middle East, Asia and North America.

"The ensemble's authentic costumes and precise performance leave every audience member breathless and anxious for more," stated a press release from BYU.

"The Gathering shows audiences that their hearts can beat in time to any tradition," stated the press release.

The dance ensemble is accompanied by the highly versatile and highly acclaimed acoustic band Mountain Strings. These musicians provide live, engaging music that is equal to the dancers in complexity, skill and professionalism.

Since 1964, IFDE has toured all over the world, representing the U.S. and American folk culture. The group has traveled to more than 100 countries with their international repertoire. The IFDE originates in the Department of Dance of the College of Fine Arts and Communications at BYU. "An extraordinary amount of time, talent
