- A Synthesis performance includes swing, blues, jazz, pop, Latin, funk, and fusion styles.
- The group is composed of saxophones, trombones, trumpets, and a full rhythm section piano, bass, guitar, and drums.
- Synthesis has performed at Jazz festivals throughout the world including the Saulkrasti
 Jazz Festival in Finland, the Rio das Ostras Jazz and Blues festival in Brazil, Antibes Jazz
 Festival in France, Kongsberg Jazz Festival in Norway, the Birmingham Jazz Festival in
 England and the Marlborough International Jazz Festival in the UK
- In 2006, Synthesis was selected to perform at the 41st San Sebastian festival. At the Ninth International Festival of Jazz in Ezcaray, a Spanish television crew filmed Synthesis for broadcast on Spain's nationwide channel 2, Televisión Española.
- The band plays original arrangements composed by members of the group as well as traditional pieces
- Formed in 1973, the 18–20 member group holds rigorous annual auditions to choose its members from among BYU's finest jazz musicians.
- In June 2001, Synthesis performed on the Queen Elizabeth II cruise ship as part of "Big Bands on the Sea". They were the only collegiate band on board and one of only three bands asked to participate.
- Synthesis' director, Benjamin Nichols, is the founder and director of the Crossover Saxophone Quartet.
- Synthesis is part of the School of Music at Brigham Young University in Provo, Utah.
 BYU is one of the nation's largest private universities with an enrollment of more than 30,000 students from across the United States and 120 foreign countries.
- In 2022 Synthesis was invited personally by Wynton Marsalis to perform as one of ten bands at the Jack Rudin Jazz Championship. They were given Best Trombone and Trumpet Sections and Outstanding Soloist awards in each section of the ensemble at this prestigious competition.
