| 2021-22 | Concert Tour to Estonia, Latvia, and Lithuania. The group competed in the 22 nd International Stasys Šimkus Choir Competition and won first place in the mixed choir, sacred music, and folk choir categories as well as the Grand Amber Prize (best choir overall), and were named winners of the Grand Prix finals. |
| 2018-19 | Concert Tour to Nevada and California. |
| 2017-18 | Concert Tour to Indonesia and Vietnam |
| 2015-16 | Concert tour to Utah and Arizona. |
| 2014-15 | Concert tour to China for the first time. The group performed at the Tsinghua University Concert Hall as part of the Meet in Beijing Arts Festival. They also performed with Beihang University Choir, Peiyang Chorus, Shaanxi Normal University Student Chorus, Zhejiang Conservatory Choir, and Wuxi Shanhe Chorus. |
| 2013-14 | Concert tour to Idaho, Washington, Oregon. Performed with the Choir of the West at Pacific Lutheran University. |
| 2011-12 | Concert tour to Wales and England. Performed at many notable halls, including St. Andrew's Hall, St. John's, Smith Square in London, concert halls in Exeter and Oxford, St. Paul's Cathedral, and Gloucester Cathedral. They also performed "Water Night" to Eric Whitacre, a piece he had composed. |
| 2010-11 | Concert tour to Colorado and Wyoming. The group also participated in the National American Choral Directors Association Convention in Chicago, IL. |
| 2008-09 | Concert tour to Ireland and England. The group traveled to the British Isles to compete in Cork International Choral Festival. BYU Singers was awarded the second place in the Fleischmann International Trophy Competition and also received the PEACE Award, an honor given to the audience's favorite choir. |
| 2007-08 | Concert tour to Utah, Nevada, and Southern California. |
| 2006-07 | Concert tour to South Africa for the first time. Performed with Johannesburg |

Gauteng Choristers and with the Soweto Songsters, a Salvation Army music ministry.

- 2005-06 BYU Singers was one of four groups invited to perform at the National Collegiate Choral Organization Conference in November 2006. This performance for the group was the third in a series of privileged concerts for the top three professional music organizations in the United States.
- 2004-05 Concert tour to Washington D.C. and for the first time to Massachusetts, Connecticut, New Hampshire, Rhode Island, Maine, Vermont, Michigan, and Quebec and Ontario, Canada. The group performed in many prestigious halls, including Harvard, Redeemer University, St. Marc de Rosemont Catholic Church in Montreal, and the Maine Center for the Arts in Bangor.
- 2003-04 Concert tour to Wyoming, Montana, Alberta and British Columbia, Canada for the first time.
- 2001-02 Guest choral group at American Choral Director's Association meeting in Honolulu, Hawaii.
- 2000-01 First BYU group to perform in the West African countries of Ghana, Benin, and Togo.
Performances in Milan and Torino, Italy.
- 1999-2000 Debut at Vocal Extravaganza in Black, held in Las Vegas, in March. Concert tour to Southern California. Songs of Praise and Remembrance, a TV program aired on over 175 PBS stations in its first year, with an annual rebroadcast.
- 1998-99 Concert tour to England, Israel, and Jordan, culminating with an independently-produced concert at Carnegie Hall in New York City. The program included a new work by American composer Eric Whitacre, commissioned for the choir by the Barlow Endowment for Music Composition. Several concerts in Israel featured the Singers with the Israel Chamber Orchestra.
- 1997-98 Concert tour to Nevada and California. Chosen as the only non-professional choir in a consortium of choirs (Netherlands Radio Choir, Vancouver Chamber Choir, Kansas City Chorale) to premiere the commissioned work of Maija Einfeldte (Latvia), winner of the 1997 Barlow International Composition Competition.

- 1996–97 Concert tour to Illinois, Indiana, Missouri, Iowa, Nebraska, Minnesota, and Wisconsin.
- 1995–96 Concert tour to New Zealand and Australia, including an invited appearance as the United States' representative to the Fourth International Choral Symposium where the choir sang a concert at the world-famous Sydney Opera House. The Singers also performed at the Brisbane Choirs of the World Festival, the University of Western Australia in Perth, and the Auckland International Music Festival.
- 1994–95 Concert tour to Russia, Estonia, Latvia, Belarus, Lithuania, and Kaliningrad.
- 1993–94 Concert tour to Nevada and Arizona. A Thanksgiving of American Folk Hymns, a TV program, aired on over 230 PBS stations in its first year, with annual rebroadcasts.
- 1992–93 Concert tour to Georgia, Tennessee, North Carolina, Virginia, and Washington, D.C. (Kennedy Center).
- 1991–92 A Celebration of Christmas, a TV program, aired on over 200 PBS stations in its first year, with annual rebroadcasts. Concert tour to Hawaii, with a featured concert by special invitation at the Western Division Convention of the American Choral Directors Association.
- 1990–91 Concert tour to Italy and Israel, including a series of concerts with the Israel Chamber Orchestra.
- 1989–90 Concert by invitation at the American Choral Directors Association convention in Fresno, California, and a concert tour to Central California.
- 1988–89 Concert tour to Jordan, Egypt, and Israel.
- 1987–88 Concert tour to Southern California.
- 1986–87 Concert tour to Idaho. Concert tour to Belgium, Germany, Austria (Brahmssaal in the Konzertverein), Switzerland, and Hungary.
