Vocal Point, Brigham Young University's renowned nine-man a cappella group, combines harmony, humor, and remarkable vocal percussion into a thrilling showcase. Members are selected for their musical ability, creativity, and stage presence—the result is exceptional sound and original, spirited performances.

In 2007 Vocal Point was voted the nation's favorite male collegiate a cappella group in the Contemporary A Cappella Society of America's A Cappella Community Awards. In 2006 Vocal Point took first place in the International Championship of Collegiate A Cappella held in New York City. In 2005 Vocal Point received three Faith-Centered Music Association "Pearl Awards," including Best Group Recording Artist and Best Performing Artist of the Year. In 2002 Vocal Point was selected to perform at nearly every major venue during the Salt Lake Winter Olympic Games.

The ensemble regularly records albums through Tantara Records, their latest release being in the fall of 2007.
