#### Dr. Nathan Haines

Nathan Haines is an accomplished conductor and educator and the new director of orchestras at Brigham Young University's School of Music. After earning a bachelor of arts in percussion from BYU, he completed a master of music

in orchestral conducting under Kory Katseanes. He holds a PhD in orchestral conducting and music education from Florida State University, where he served as the associate conductor of orchestras, taught courses in conducting, and pursued research in the art of conducting and music education under the mentorship of Dr. Alexander Jiménez.

Haines's career has taken him to prestigious venues across the globe, with performances in Asia and Europe. In 2024, he was invited to guest conduct for the world-class Ballet West in their production of *Jekyll and Hyde*. He is also a strong advocate for the orchestral arts, particularly in new and innovative projects. His dissertation at Florida State, "Conducting with Multimedia in Live Performance," provides a framework of techniques and technologies that conductors can use on the modern concert stage.

When not conducting orchestras, Haines enjoys writing, alpine skiing, disc golfing, and hiking. He is supported by his wife, Elise, who holds a master's degree in media and performance studies from BYU. They have two beautiful and energetic children.

# BYU CHAMBER ORCHESTRA

BYU's Chamber Orchestra is composed of 51 of the university's finest musicians. The ensemble demonstrates a mastery of classical and contemporary works and has earned the highest recommendation rating from the National Endowment for the Arts. Chamber Orchestra regularly tours in the United States and Canada and has also performed internationally, including in China, Egypt, Italy, and Turkey. In 2017 the orchestra performed twice with Broadway star Lea Salonga: once at BYU and again on tour in Salonga's hometown of Manila, Philippines. The orchestra also put together a collaborative album with Salonga titled *The Story of My Life: Lea Salonga Live from Manila*, which received the 2020 BroadwayWorld Album Award for Best New EP/Solo Release. For a university orchestra, it was not only a prestigious achievement but it was, in the words of then-director Kory Katseanes, "virtually unheard of. It's unbelievable—but not undeserved—that BYU won."
