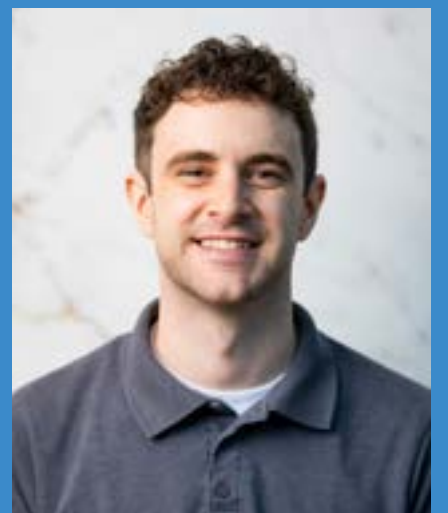

Director

Andrew Crane

Andrew Crane joined the BYU faculty in 2015. His main duties include conducting the Brigham Young University Singers and teaching courses in the graduate conducting curriculum. Previous to this appointment, he served for four years as director of choral activities at East Carolina University and for six years in the same position at California State University, San Bernardino. He is also the former choral director at Provo High School.



Choirs under his direction have appeared by invitation at numerous state, regional, and national conferences of the American Choral Directors Association, National Association for Music Education, and National Collegiate Choral Organization. Recent examples include the ACDA 2025 National Conference in Dallas, the 2022 ACDA Western Division conference in Long Beach, CA, the ACDA 2019 National Conference in Kansas City, and the NCCO national conference in Baton Rouge, LA.

In 2024, the BYU Singers, under Crane, won the Fleischmann International Trophy Competition at the Cork International Choral Festival in Ireland. In 2022, Andrew Crane led the choir to multiple first place prizes at the 22nd International Stasys Šimkus Choir Competition (Klaipėda, Lithuania), including the Grand Amber award for best overall choir. In 2015, he led the East Carolina University Chamber Singers to first place at the Gallus International Choral Competition in Maribor Slovenia, and in 2012, the ensemble, under his direction, was named the winner of the American Prize in Choral Performance, College/University Division.

In addition to his choral conducting and teaching, Crane has performed as a tenor in professional ensembles, having sung with such groups as Seraphic Fire, Santa Fe Desert Chorale, Yale Choral Artists, Spire Chamber Ensemble, Carnegie Hall Festival Chorus, and many others. As a soloist, he has performed the tenor roles in much of the standard concert repertoire for chorus and orchestra with organizations throughout the United States and in Europe.

Andrew Crane has served as an ad hoc choral director, speaker, adjudicator, and presenter in 20 states across the United States, as well as in Switzerland, China, Indonesia, Italy, Vietnam, and the French Caribbean. Additionally, Crane edits a choral series in his name for the prestigious Walton Music publishing house. He and his wife Casandria (also a BYU alumna) reside in American Fork, UT and are the parents of four children.

Brigham Young University

BYU Singers

The BYU Singers are an exciting choir with impressive voices and a versatile style. Directed by Andrew Crane, the group performs works from nearly every musical genre, as well as many original works written or arranged for the choir.

In May 2024, the BYU Singers won first place in the Fleischmann International Trophy Competition at the Cork International Choral Festival in Ireland. In 2022, they received multiple first place awards at the International Stasys Šimkus Choir Competition (Klaipėda, Lithuania), including the Grand Amber Award for Best Choir. In 2021, the group placed first in the mixed choir category and won the Grand Prix Overall at the International Youth Choir Festival "Aegis carminis" (Koper, Slovenia). The ensemble also competed at the 53rd Toulouse Choral Competition (Spain), where they received numerous awards and cash prizes.

They have performed at some of the world's most prestigious venues, including Carnegie Hall in New York City, the Kennedy Center in Washington, the Sydney Opera House and Town Hall, the Kauffman Center in Kansas City, the Hanoi Opera House, the St. Petersburg Kapella, the Vienna Musikverein, and the Walt Disney Concert Hall in Los Angeles. They have toured throughout the United States and to 27 countries, including Russia, Germany, Switzerland, Italy, England, Egypt, Australia, Ghana, Ireland, China, Indonesia, Vietnam, and the Baltic States. The choir was the U.S. representative at the Fourth World Choral Symposium in 1996, performed at the inaugural conference of the National Collegiate Choral Organization in 2006, and has appeared numerous times at state, national, and regional conferences of the American Choral Directors Association, the National Association for Music Education, and the National Collegiate Choral Organization since 1985. The choir has appeared on national television in four programs created for the Corporation for Public Broadcasting. The BYU Singers were founded in 1984 by Ronald Staheli.

The BYU Singers are comprised of approximately 40 students pursuing a variety of undergraduate and graduate degrees in fields such as computer science, accounting, law, engineering, and music. The ensemble originated in the School of Music in the College of Fine Arts & Communications at Brigham Young University in Provo, Utah. BYU is one of the nation's largest private universities with an enrollment of more than 30,000 students from all parts of the United States and 120 foreign countries.
