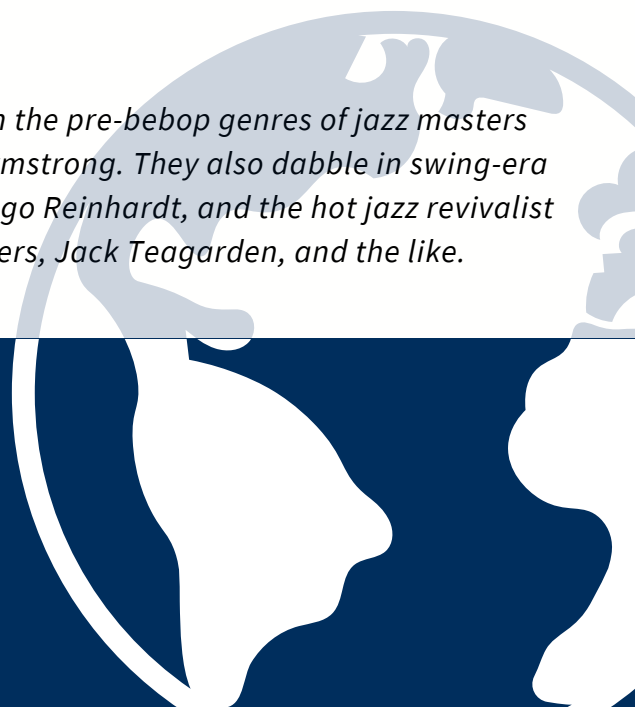


The Show
