The year began with a special invitation from the Shanghai International Arts Festival, where Noteworthy joined Vocal Point, Young Ambassadors, and Ballroom Dance on stage in China for BYU Spectacular, bringing music and dance to audiences across the world.

November brought two new releases, including the Christmas EP “In Her Arms”, consisting of six songs centered on Mary, the mother of Jesus, featuring solo artist Peter Hollens and BYU Women’s Chorus. The songs are a beautiful reminder of Noteworthy’s purpose to empower women to discover their divine nature.

Alongside the new releases, the ensemble performed both on campus and throughout Utah County, sharing its signature blend of music, energy, and personality with audiences.



This spring, Noteworthy once again joined Vocal Point on stage to bring their music to the US Midwest and Northeast on a three-week summer tour. Together, they visited Illinois, Iowa, Pennsylvania, New York, Massachusetts, and Washington, D.C., performing numerous
