Brigham Young University Singers is one of America's premier university choirs. Founded in 1984 by Ronald Staheli and now directed by Andrew Crane, the ensemble has earned international distinction, including top prizes at major European competitions. BYU Singers has performed in renowned venues such as Carnegie Hall, the Sydney Opera House, and the Kennedy Center, and has toured throughout the United States and 28 countries. With national television appearances, ten full-length albums, and a strong global streaming presence, the choir maintains an active profile both on stage and online.

- On the international stage BYU Singers has won overall first place honors in the following European competitions: World Choir Festival and Competition on Musicals (2025, Thessaloniki, Greece); Fleischmann International Trophy Competition at the Cork International Choral Festival (2024, Cork, Ireland); International Stasys Šimkus Choir Competition (2022, Klaipėda, Lithuania); and Aegis carminis (2021, Koper, Slovenia)."
- They have performed at New York Metropolitan Opera House and Carnegie Hall in New York City, the Sydney Opera House, The Kapella in St. Petersburg, the Musikverein in Vienna, and the Walt Disney Concert Hall in Los Angeles.

The ensemble performs repertoire spanning Renaissance polyphony to contemporary choral works, alongside original compositions and distinctive arrangements created specifically for the choir. Their programming balances sacred and secular traditions while highlighting lyrical tone, textual clarity, and dynamic contrast. - Participate in service performances at hospitals, care centers, and humanitarian venues
- Perform full-length or tailored concerts for a variety of audiences and settings
