Directed by Dr. Andrew Crane and founded in 1984 by Dr. Ronald Staheli, BYU Singers has earned international acclaim for its artistry and versatility, performing everything from Renaissance motets to African-American spirituals. Maurice Casey, former ACDA president, praised the ensemble as “one of the premier choral organizations in the country”.

The choir has toured extensively across the U.S. and in more than 20 countries on five continents, including Romania, Italy, Egypt, Jordan, Russia, China, and South Africa. Highlights include three invited performances with the Israeli Chamber Orchestra and representing the U.S. at the Fourth World Symposium on Choral Music in Sydney, Australia. BYU Singers is also a frequent guest at regional and national ACDA conferences.

Honors

- In 2025, BYU Singers competed at the World Choir Festival and Competition on Musicals in Thessaloniki, Greece.
- In 2024, the choir participated in the Fleischmann International Trophy Competition at the Cork International Choral Festival in Ireland.
- In 2022, BYU Singers earned multiple prizes at the International Stasys Šimkus Choir Competition in Klaipėda, Lithuania.
- In 2021, the ensemble secured first place in the mixed choir category and the overall Grand Prix award at the Aegis Carminis International Youth Choir Festival in Koper, Slovenia.

Outreach Efforts

BYU Singers extend their impact through school visits, collaborative workshops, sacred concerts, and international outreaches. Their efforts include devotionals, cultural exchanges, interfaith events, and performances in community settings across the globe.

As a premiere chamber choir performing classical, sacred, and contemporary works, they are equipped to:

- Teach choral techniques in schools, universities, and community programs (topics include blend, diction, expression, and conducting)
- Lead inspirational devotionals and firesides through music and spoken word
- Collaborate with local choirs, conductors, and music educators for masterclasses and joint performances
- Participate in service performances at hospitals, care centers, and humanitarian venues
- Perform full-length or tailored concerts for a variety of audiences and settings
